1. A candle from Bridgewater Candle Company

Every candle purchased from this company feeds a child in need 3 meals. If that's not enough, the candles smell AMAZING. My favorite is the Sweet Grace collection, but they offer a variety of scents including a special holiday collection.



2. A necklace from PURPOSE Jewelry

PURPOSE Jewelry is beautifully crafted by young women rescued from human trafficking. By "purchasing with PURPOSE" (as they say on their site), you are providing freedom, dignity and hope for these brilliant artisans. If necklaces aren't your thing, they also have earrings, bracelets and rings available.



3. This special coffee + mug bundle from Dot Products and SoloHope

Drink your coffee by the fireside and know that you're supporting hardworking farmers and artists in Honduras. SoloHope (Spanglish for "Only Hope") seeks to empower individuals and communities through providing economic development, education and discipleship.



4. A leather-bound journal from Lazarus Artisan Goods

Lazarus Artisan Goods was born out of a vocational training program. When you purchase a hand crafted leather piece from them, you're supporting the Honduran hands who took time and care to make the item. Each of their products can be traced back to when it was produced and who worked on it. They also offer wallets, bags and other leather items.



5. A pair of Jonas Paul Eyeware glasses

This one really only applies if you have a kid who wears glasses, but this company is making a major impact in preventing childhood blindness through their mission, "buy sight, give sight." For every frame sold, they donate Vitamin A supplements for 2 children in a developing country.



6. Recycled shoes from Rothy's

Rothy's knit uppers are made from 100% post-consumer plastic water bottles. Their mission is to create women's shoes that are chic, durable and made with as little waste and impact to the environment as possible. It doesn't hurt that they're cute and comfortable as well. Lots of colors and styles to choose from.



7. A purse or bag from ABLE

ABLE is a lifestyle brand focused on ending generational poverty through providing economic opportunity for women. After a trip to Ethiopia, their founder saw how poverty forced women into prostitution and wanted to create a way for these women to instead learn to work and be empowered through their gifts. They also have cute clothes, bags and jewelry.



8. A bottle of ONEHOPE wine

As if you needed another reason to buy a bottle of wine for the holidays, ONEHOPE donates 50% of the proceeds from every bottle to an awesome charity. The charity varies depending on the bottle you choose, but they've made more than \$3 million in donations to date, provided 46,000 people with global health care, 49,000 homes for shelter animals, 1.8 million meals for children and 163,000 life saving vaccines. Plus the wine tastes fantastic!



9. Soap or lotion from Hand in Hand Sustainable Suds

Buy a bar, give a bar. For every item purchased, this company donates a bar of soap to a child in Haiti. After learning that 5 million children die each year from water-related illnesses and that nearly half of those deaths could be prevented by hand washing alone, this couple set out to make a difference. To date, they've donated more than a million bars of soap and built or repaired 4 wells that provide thousands of people with clean water.



10. An umbrella from Jonas Umbrellas

Here's another one that provides clean water. Every limited edition umbrella purchased funds a clean-water well at a school in Uganda. Once they've finished one well (which saves the lives of approximately 1,000 children), they'll never make that edition again but will move on to another. The cool part about this one is you can register your umbrella's number and follow pictures, videos and blogs about the well YOU specifically helped fund.
